2 Calculated Look

3 Updated Classic

Timeless herringbone patterns are easy to achieve with Torlys's Everest Twist hardwood. The Uniclic system is available in oak and walnut, and incorporates an integrated cork underlay that provides acoustic insulation, warmth and protection against mould and mildew. *torlys.com*

4 Plus-sized Planks

Harvested from Germany's Black Forest, Madera's Titan Balanced comprises massive European oak planks up to 20 feet long and 16 inches wide. The three-ply product incorporates a soft pine core to enhance stability. madera-trade.com

Thought bubbles, smiley faces and speech balloons decorate the surface of Hanky Panky, a playful parquet floor by Cyprus-based YO2. The tongue-and-groove system features an African oak top layer and comes in 15-centimetre-wide planks up to two metres long.
